On Friday, March 19, four firefighters from the Elkford Fire Department, one engine and one support apparatus extinguished a fully involved vehicle fire at 12:43 p.m. The vehicle, a five-tonne service truck,

was being towed to a local mechanical shop when it suddenly burst into flames. Firefighters on the scene were able to guickly extinguish the fire, keeping it from spreading to a nearby trailer.

Elkford firefighter, Lydon Simmons, was among those battling the blaze on Friday afternoon. "Those tanks of acetylene in the back of the truck were [very] close to the flames," comments Simmons.

There were no reports of injuries to the tow-truck operator or Elkford firefighters working at the scene. The guick actions of the tow-truck operator are being credited for helping to avert a potential catastrophe.

The vehicle was a total write-off, and the cause of this fire was deemed unsuspicious in nature.

A friendly reminder from the fire department that all drivers on the road must pull over and come to a stop when you see flashing lights and/or hear the sirens of approaching emergency responders. regardless of which direction the emergency vehicles are travelling.
