Urban Wildlife Annual Deer Count: September 13



On the evening of Wednesday, September 13, Elkford's Urban Wildlife Committee will be conducting the annual urban deer count within the community.

While this count is being performed on the evening of September 13, please do not be surprised or alarmed if you see vehicles driving around slowly in areas where there are urban deer, including stopping in front of or near private residences where deer are visible.

This deer count has been taking place annually for several years in Elkford and is common practice in several municipalities. Its purpose is for monitoring urban deer populations, Including tracking demographics and trends, in order to assist the municipality in its urban wildlife management actions and plans.

Report all Conflict With Wildlife to the RAPP Line: 1.877.952.7277

Autumn is peak season for wildlife encounters in British Columbia. Please do your part to protect our local wildlife and reduce attractants: dispose of trash properly and store it securely (indoors or in a bear-proof enclosure), remove bird feeders while bears are awake (birds can find plenty of food on their own during the warmer months and feeders attract unwanted guests like bears, rats and mice to your yard), always use a bear-resistant garbage bin, regularly harvest all fruit and berries from your trees and place your garbage curbside ONLY between **5 and 7 a.m.** on the morning of garbage pickup.

Always report all conflict with wildlife, suspected poaching and violations of fisheries, wildlife and environmental protection laws to the **RAPP Hotline** at **1.877.952.7277** or by completing their online form. The RAPP Hotline is a confidential, toll-free, 24/7 tip-line manned by B.C. Conservation Officer Service.
