

Plan Ahead for Winter Conditions

Winter isn't coming—it's here! Here are some important tips for winter driving in the mountains and preparing for months of snowy and icy driving conditions ahead:

- Outfit your vehicle with a set of properly matched winter tires and replace/upgrade them as needed
- Upgrade to winter wiper blades, which are designed for clearing snow and ice
- Perform a winter maintenance check on your vehicle, including battery, brakes, cooling and heating, exhaust systems and lights
- Maintain a safe distance while driving (remember that it takes significantly longer to stop on ice and snow, so stay well back from other vehicles, ideally the length of two semi-trucks or more!)
- Pack a cold-weather survival kit, and keep it in your vehicle at all times
- Have tire chains at the ready and know how to equip them
- Keep your gas tank full (or nearly full) at all times—if you're caught in a whiteout or stuck waiting during a road closure and have to idle to stay warm, you'll be thankful!
- Clear your vehicle's exhaust pipe regularly of snow, mud and debris
- Avoid passing unless it's absolutely necessary, don't hug the centre line and avoid using cruise control
- Plan ahead: leave early, dress warmly, carry a charged cell phone, expect delays and drive at speeds appropriate to the conditions
