2024 Business & Pet Licence Renewals

It's time to renew your business and pet licences for 2024! Renewal notices were mailed out at the beginning of January.

Annual fees for business licences are:

- New OR Annual Renewal for Business Licence: \$100
- New *OR* Annual Renewal for Youth Business Licence: \$20
- New OR Annual Renewal for Inter-Community Business Licence (ICBL): \$100 (note that the ICBL fee is in addition to your \$100 fee for your municipal business licence)

The due date for all business licence fees is **January 31, 2024**.

The dog/cat pet licence fee is \$50 annually for an unsterilized licence and \$20 for a spayed/neutered licence.

Are you a new pet owner? You must purchase a licence for your dog or cat. Please bring the certificate of spaying/neutering for first time registration. The due date for all pet licence fees is February 29, 2024. For pet licences, a late fee of \$20 applies after February 29, 2024.

Registered non-profit organizations in Elkford can now apply for the 2024 Financial Assistance Grants! Applications are due by **February 29, 2024**.



Is Your Address Visible?

Did you know that the majority of fire fatalities occur in one and two-storey residential family homes? According to the BC Office of the Fire Commissioner, 75 per cent occur in the winter months—all in time of darkness, when address identification is most difficult.

The Elkford Fire Department asks you to take a moment to assess your home for outside address identification. In the event of an emergency, will your home's address be visible to emergency first responders? Is your address clearly marked? Will it be covered in snow or hidden in the darkness? If it is inadequate or in need of repair, please take the time to repair or improve it. It could save your life!

As the holiday season winds down, the Elkford Fire Department is reminding everyone to get rid of your live trees after Christmas. Dried-out trees are a fire danger and should not be left in the home or garage (or leaning up against your home!).

Speaking of Christmas: it's highly recommended to bring outdoor lights inside after the holidays to prevent hazards. As a bonus, that greatly increases their lifespan!

Don't forget the winter parking bylaw! From **November 1 to March 31**, on-street parking is prohibited between the hours of **6 a.m. to 4 p.m.** in order to ensure optimal snow removal.

Bleeder Valves: ON


A friendly reminder to all residents to turn **ON** the bleeder valves in your residences from **October 31 to May 1**. This important bylaw is in place to prevent your pipes from freezing and cracking in colder temperatures.

Keep Kids off of Roadside Snowbanks

Every time it snows, Public Works operators work to cut back snow banks and snow piles to widen our roadways. Please ensure that children do not play in snow berms or on snow piles along roads.

Operators don't have x-ray vision: they are unable to see tunnels carved in the snow and cannot always see children who are playing on snow banks. Additionally, tunneling in snow piles is very dangerous in itself, often resulting in fatalities when snow forts collapse.

Please play it safe! Kids (and kids at heart) can always safely toboggan and play in the snow at the toboggan hill that is piled high beside the District Office and running into the soccer field. When dark falls, the hill is lit up for some quintessential winter fun!



Illegal Dumping



A friendly reminder that trash does not belong in the backcountry, along forest service roads, in greenspaces or at McGulley's (where the yellow bins used to be situated).

The **Elkford Transfer Station**, operated by the RDEK, handles all recycling in Elkford at **6 Inkaneep Road** in the Industrial Park. Currently, the Elkford Transfer station is open *six days per week*, from Monday to Saturday, excluding statutory holidays.

Using the dump to dispose of household garbage and items—in most cases— is FREE, as is recycling most recyclable items. Contact the Elkford Transfer Station directly at **1.250.489.6900** for more information.
